<u>Members' Committee:</u> We now have a Members' Room and new laptop. Members can meet, rehearse and plan their own work.

Arts Awards: Chris & Michael are our first members to gain Bronze Awards. Five members are taking the award next year.

<u>Platform 11+:</u> Artistic Director Helen Stanley represented LYT in Portugal presenting the *School Ties* project to an audience of over 1000.

<u>Story telling:</u> *Space Girl*, our new story for under 8s, was created for and performed at People's Day.

<u>See Theatre Project:</u> Members raised £2000 and took 200 young people and families to the theatre for free.

VOLUNTEERS AND PARTNERSHIPS

Volunteers continue to bring a wealth of experience to our organisation as well as being an inspiration to our young members. Collaborations and partnerships in the year ahead: Clean Break Theatre Company, Teatro Vivo Theatre Company, Rose Bruford Drama College, London Met University, Diverse City. This year we partnered with four local primary and three secondary schools. Next year we plan to continue these local links and work with two new schools.

April to June 2010 Arts & Drama Project "Well Bellingham" 30 participants, aged 8 to 13

Partnership with Bellingham Gateway Youth Club. Weekly after-school drama and art sessions exploring life in Bellingham. Participants created an exhibition for the Bellingham Festival in June.

June 2010 performances

Junior Youth Theatre - 8 to 14s "Friendly Matches" & "Three Cheers for Mrs Butler" by Allan Ahlberg 40 participants, aged 8 to 11

Two performances in the Broadway Studio Theatre of this poetic comedy. 180 audience members celebrated with us.

October 2010 to April 2011

Senior Youth Theatre - Acting Company "Past Tense" Intergenerational Performance 15 performers, aged 15-78 Contributions from 30 additional members

Multimedia theatre performance with Age Exchange as part of Lewisham's Intergenerational Festival. The project culminated in three performances in the Broadway Studio Theatre in April 2011. A short film of the project will be on our new website soon.

October 2010 to April 2011 Senior Youth Theatre -Workshop Group "East End Tales" by Fin Kennedy 15 participants, aged 14 to 16

The young company developed into a cracking group of performers and presented extracts from "East End Tales" in three performances in April.

November to December 2010 Schools Project "New Perspectives" 135 participants, aged 12 to 14

Script workshops with four secondary schools explored the work of writers from diverse cultural backgrounds. The group performed at the The Albany, Deptford in December 2010.

January 2011 (on going) Junior Youth Theatre Workshops 45 participants, aged 8 to 11

Targeted recruitment in four local schools. In weekly sessions, members learn drama skills and develop social and communication skills.
