### **OUR YEAR IN NUMBERS**

- 1 performance at a West End Theatre Tristan Bates Theatre, Covent Garden
- daytime outreach projects for over 16's
- 3 collaborations with local arts organisations.
- 17 young people in our Members Committee.
- 25 members took part in our Christmas Play.
- 46 young people took part in our Senior Youth Theatre.
- 161 young people took part in our sustained youth theatre projects.
- 113,495 pounds Big Lottery funding for project costs over the next 5 years!

### **OUR PROJECTS**

### April to August 2011 See Theatre

Thanks to the Positive Activities Fund and Team London, we took 110 young people to the theatre for free.

### May to July 2011 Teatro Vivo Collaboration -Junior Youth Theatre, 12-14s

20 young people took part in 8 weeks of exploration into new ways to create theatre. Members experienced Teatro Vivo's promenade performance of *Alice in Wonderland* in all the non-theatre spaces at the Broadway.

# June 2011 - "Ananse and the School Journey" Junior Youth Theatre, 8 -11s

Based on the tales of Ananse the spider, 35 young actors created a new twist on the old stories for two performances

in the Broadway Studio.

### July - August 2011 - "Seeing Red"

Senior Youth Theatre, aged 18+

In partnership Diverse City, Clean Break Theatre Company & the National Youth Theatre, 10 performers created a curtain raiser in response to "The Quick," a powerful play about restorative justice, and performed at the Tristan Bates Theatre, Covent Garden.

### Sept – Oct 2011 - "Woven Tales" Junior Youth Theatre, 12-14s

20 young people took part in this short, focused project leading to a scratch performance retelling ancient Greek Tales for family & friends in the Broadway theatre rehearsal room.



# October 11 to April 2012 Metamorphoses by Mary Zimmerman Senior Youth Theatre, 15 - 21s

18 performers took part in this amazing collaboration with Irie! dance theatre & Rose Bruford with original music composed by Junior James (LYT Graduate) leading to performances in the Broadway Studio & at Rose Bruford's Theatre Symposium.




#### December 2011 - Christmas Play in a Day

# January to April 2012 - "One Dream Between" Senior Youth Theatre, 14-18s

18 performers continued our Greek theme by devising this performance in response to the story of Orpheus & Eurydice, performing two shows at the Broadway Studio in April '12.



#### Junior Youth Theatre, 8 - 11s (ongoing)

Weekly drama skills workshops, engaging 40 participants with targeted recruitment in 5 local schools.

Senior Youth Theatre performed at the Tram Shed in Greenwich as part of this festival celebrating youth theatre across London.







### **NEW DEVELOPMENTS**

### STEP UP Project -

This exciting new strand of LYT's activities works with young people aged 16-21 not in education, employment or training (NEET) using drama to develop life skills and increase ambition and achievement.

### This year's Step Up Project:

- Dylan's Story Working with Central School of Speech & Drama 3rd Year Applied Theatre Students, this Forum Theatre performance toured to Youth settings borough-wide.
- John Evelyn Pupil Referral Unit a 6 week project using drama to build confidence & increase life skills
- Life Skills Drama Project Daytime sessions for young people aged 16+ who are not in education, employment or training.
- One to One Mentoring Tailored advice and support with career & education choices.

**Funding:** We are very pleased to announce that we have secured funding from the Big Lottery Reaching Communities fund contributing to our project costs over the next 5 years and that our grant from London Borough of Lewisham is confirmed until 2014. This gives us a very solid base from which to develop and grow.
